LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

And his mother kept all these words in her

heart. - S. Luke 2:51

CUMMER is now upon us Nand many feel quite happy that there is some time to relax and enjoy family vacations and so on. However...it is also time for us all to be reminded of two important things Catholics: **Sunday** (and Holy Days) Mass obligation and Modesty. Every Sunday of the year is indeed a Holy Day of Obligation and vacations do not excuse from that obligation (quite the opposite): to miss Holy Mass on any Sunday is a sin mortal requires Confession and Absolution. Since vacations are planned advance it is highly advisable that you take your Sunday Mass attendance into consideration. Asking your pastor (in this case me, your Monsignor) if there is a safe (valid and actual Latin Catholic Mass location) place for Holy Mass is the first step: if there is not then you may ask your pastor (again, in this case me, Monsignor) vour dispensation: and when it is granted you will be given an alternative for your obligation, reading the Mass prayers as a family and then reading the sermon. One cannot dispense themselves from their obligation. Even I seek certain dispensations (not from offering Holy Mass or

praying the Office... ever) from my Spiritual Director or my Confessor: everyone has a *Spiritual Boss*!

As for Modesty it is quite shocking that even some of the most traditional of Catholics forget about their appearance; let me first address attending Holy Mass and other Sacred Services in Church and then I shall address modesty in general. Holy Mass is never a casual event, most especially when Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is present, and the excuse that "God does not care what I wear" is keenly contradicted by Our Blessed Lord Himself (cf. S. Matthew 22:1 - 10 and S. Luke 14:16 -24).



Yes, the wedding garment means being clothed in the grace of Christ but it also reminds us that we are to be properly attired for such holy events. As for modesty, Our Blessed Lady of Fatima was explicit when she said to little Jacinta: Certain fashions will be introduced which will offend Our Divine Lord very much...the sins

that lead most souls to hell are sins of the flesh.

It is an adherence to the wiles of the flesh or feigned comfort that causes immodesty, which in turn causes the temptations of others. The entire purpose of immodest dress is to appear attractive and enticing others, and what are we attracting others to and what are we enticing others towards? To ourselves and to sin: seducers are minions of the devil and agents of sin, as S. James rightly admonishes us: when concupiscence hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin. But sin, when it is completed, begetteth death (S. James 1:15). We must refrain anything that encourage others to sin, while avoiding the wicked ourselves, as the Apostle admonishes us: seduced: Evil not communications corrupt good manners (I Corinthians 15:33)!

It is true that this is indeed going to be a very long and hot summer; but one can dress both *lightly* (in lightweight fabrics) and *modestly* and thereby remain comfortable and dignified, and giving holy example to others.

As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

•We live in a time of supreme casualty, most people now feel dressing more formally as oppression, there is photo unless a opportunity. I recall my first aeroplane ride: I was attired in suite, tie and cap. It was normal dress for any important event, most especially Holy Mass. I never saw a man, even those gravely impoverished, without a jacket and tie inside the church...ever. At dinner in my grandparent's home, where I resided until I was 10 years old, my grandfather wore his work suit and I put my school uniform back on before I came to table...a very different time and place.

Today part of restoring the sacredness of Holy Mass is the family *dressing* properly; jackets and ties for men and boys and proper and modest dresses with head coverings (veils or hats) for women and girls.

Sports shoes, collarless shirts, shorts are never appropriate. We must remember that we are coming before Our Lord and King Jesus Christ in His Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the court of heaven is present

there and our attire, while not part of a fashion show, must always be respectful of God's true presence as well as the dignity of our own souls.

SUNDAYS OF AUGUST: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for August:

7 August 2022:

Ninth Sunday after Pentecost: Commemoration of S. Ca jetan and the S. Donatus at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

14 August 2022:

Tenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Eusebius and the Suffrage of the Saints at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

21 August 2022:

Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Jane Frances de Chantal and of the Octave of the Assumption at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

28 August 2022:

Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Augustine and the S. Hermes at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the *Ordinary of the Mass*, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the

Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret. Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
