LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

Stilk up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued, and be saved by Thy deliverance.

Collect from the (Pass of the Sirst Sunday in Advent

OUR need for a Saviour remains, and this is why we pray that our Lord Jesus Christ comes to us, at the Incarnation and Nativity as well as at the consummation of the world. Prophet teaches Therefore the Lord Himself shall give you a sign. Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and His Name shall be called Emmanuel (Isaias 7:14), and he continues: For a Child is born to us, and a Son is given to us, and the government is upon His shoulder: and His Name shall be called, Wonderful, Counsellor, God the Mighty, the Father of the world to come, the Prince of Peace. His Empire shall be multiplied, and there shall be no end of peace: He shall sit upon the throne of David, and upon His Kingdom; to establish it and strengthen it with judgment and with justice, from henceforth and forever: the zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this (Isaias 9:6-7).

The Advent season is one of the most joyful of the entire Liturgical Year, this is because of the two-fold promise of Our Lord and God: this world shall receive a

Saviour and Redeemer (promise kept) and that He shall return at the consummation of this material world (promise to come).

The Advent season also reminds us to look at the world through the innocent eyes of a child, with great wonder and joy, remembering the admonition of the Saviour: Amen I say to you, unless you be converted, and become as little children, you shall not enter into the Kingdom of heaven (S. Matthew 18:3).



This command towards innocence includes the virtue of purity; we must, without exception, embrace Holy Purity, in body, mind and soul. When man lost his original innocence he took upon himself original sin, hence his need for a spiritual remedy: Our Lord and Redeemer Jesus Christ, Who teaches us: Blessed are the clean of heart: for they shall see God (S. Matthew 5:8).

This world is at odds with Holy Purity and wicked impurity is everywhere, most especially at our fingertips. Yet, wickedness cannot win, because goodness is greater: the goodness of God is glorious

and powerful, as the Psalmist prays: Praise the Lord, for He is good: for His mercy endureth forever (Psalm 135:1).

Lastly, we have entered into the season of Hope, and as look. forward commemoration of Our Lord's Nativity let us not forget to look with hope for His glorious return, as the Apostle reminds us: And that knowing the season; that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep. For now our salvation is nearer than when we believed (Romans 13:11)! We do not await in fear or horror, rather, we hold to the promise of Our Lord that we will be preserved by Him in the last days; And unless those days had been shortened, no flesh should be saved: but for the sake of the elect those days shall be shortened (S. Matthew 24:22). If we remain faithful and hold strong in the hope we will save our souls and be rewarded with eternity in the bliss of God's perfect presence.

May this season bring you and your families joy and hope, keep a faithful watch for the Saviour, and please pray for our little Chapel family every day during Holy Advent.

As always, be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

My Lord:
*Civil Law removes the obligation of a debt through "bankruptcy", even if at a later time one may be able to pay the debt back. Does this also satisfy the moral obligation to pay back a debt?

A While a Civil Court can remove the *legal* obligation to pay back a material debt when the holder of the debt agrees, even in perpetuity, however, this does not fully remove the moral obligation to restore in justice what is lawfully owed when possible. This can also be done in other ways, e.g.: the person who holds a personal debt dies - this does not forgive the debt, rather, the borrower must still find a way to pay back either a relative or even donate to a charitable organisation in the name of he who was owed.

> SUNDAYS OF **DECEMBER:** THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for December:

1 December 2024:

First Sunday in Advent:

Commemoration of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Secret Collect. and Postcommunion.

8 December 2024: Immaculate Conception of the

BVM:

Commemoration of the Second Sunday in Advent at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

15 December 2024: Third Sunday in Advent:

Commemoration of the Octave of the Immaculate Conception at the Collect. Secret and Postcommunion.

22 December 2024:

Fourth Sunday in Advent:

Commemoration of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

29 December 2024:

Sunday within the Octave of Christmas:

Commemoration of S. Thomas of Canterbury and the Octave of the Nativity at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.


