LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

The Season, upon which we are now entering, is expressive of several profound mysteries. But these mysteries belong not only to the three weeks, which are preparatory to Lent; they continue throughout the whole period of time, which separates us from the great Seast of Easter.

HS we prepare ourselves to denter into the great and holy season of **Lent**, it is of great importance to take this season seriously and with purpose. The Holy Church has always called for *fast* and *abstinence* during times of great persecution and sin, as well as in preparation for a holy season or feast. We are in times of *great evil*, with the Holy Church and her faithful being persecuted by her enemies.

I am begging the faithful to take serious this year's Lententide for the sanctification and protection of the Holy Church. Prayer, Penance and Sacrifice must be taken seriously and with greater focus and intent in order to relieve these demonic attacks or to give us the grace to withstand them.

In the holy liturgy of this season we notice a few *changes*, first, the Gloria, Alleluia and Ita Missa Est are omitted at Holy Mass (the *Ita* Missa Est is replaced by the Benedicámus Dómino – Let us bless the Lord). A wonderful tradition of this season is the Burying of the Alleluia. At the office of Vespers (Evening Prayer) the praying, or singing, of the Alleluia is done so quite afterwards solemnly, the clergy, accompanied by the faithful, "bury" the Alleluia by the use of a scroll or plaque with ALLELUIA written on it in either the churchyard or another appropriate "resting place" and then it is "resurrected" on Holy Saturday, the Vigil of Easter.

One of the greatest tragedies of the post-conciliar NewChurch is the destruction of so many lovely Catholic customs that united Catholic Families with the Holy Church, such as the Epiphany Blessing of Water and Chalk with the head of the home "marking" the lintel of the main entrance with the initials of the *Magi*. Such wonderful customs directly connected the hierarchy of the Church with the hierarchy of the Domestic Church, that is, the family. When I was a boy I remember that it was my grandfather (my Da) who always led our grace at table. If he was absent due to work then my grandmother (my Nonnie) would lead it. There was no egalitarian "your turn" by anyone else at the table: once my cousin Jimmy and I were on an outing and when it came time for us to have our lunch it was he who lead our grace, because he was ten months older then I was...he still reminds me of that fact!

As I informed all you dear readers last month, our little **Priestly Society** was blessed to receive a new seminarian who has begun his Spiritual Year, and with your prayers and sacrifices for him and all seminarians, God's grace will provide them with what they need to fulfil their vocations!

This year I will also keep our plea for your open assistance: we must work hard for a permanent home for our Chapel, which means we need your prayers and sacrifices. We need to raise close to \$100,000.00 that will serve as a down payment for a property and then we will need your commitment to assist monthly to sustain that property. If you can assist in this goal, one time or monthly, we will be grateful and can promise that God will surely bless you.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

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Wy Lord Bishop: It seems that almost everyone I know now has tattoos. When I was younger this was a sign of rebellion and criminal behavior, but it seems today *everyone* has them, even some traditional Catholics. Can you please give us the Church's true teaching on tattoos?

As I stated in my letter at the beginning of this newsletter, we live in wicked times, and the purposeful mutilation of one's body's is a confirmation of such wickedness. Over a decade ago an individual came to me and showed me their latest "body art" (a repulsive term, since the body is the perfection of God's art): it was an image of Our Lady with this person's mother's name and life dates. I was quite taken aback and stated this was sinful mutilation of one's body, to which the response was "But this is in honour of Our Lady and in memory of my dead mother," and I apologized for failing to teach them of this most holy and explicit teaching: You shall not make any cuttings in your flesh, for the dead, neither shall you make in yourselves any figures or marks: I am the Lord (Leviticus 19:28). So this poor person was hit with a double the purposeful and sin; forbidden marking of their body and the commemoration of the dead with that same mutilation.

Because of the NewChurch's disregard for the sacredness of the body, hence the tolerance of mutilation of the body with tattoos, modifications and the like (this "gender includes so called reassignment" mutilation) and that the sacredness of our body which belongs not to us but to God as Temples of the Holy Ghost (cf. I Corinthians 6:19). This also leads to the great sacrilege of *cremation* of the body, as it is denial explicit of an resurrection and restoration of the body.

Now, if after being aware of such made a prohibition individual an continues such mutilation of their body a pastoral penalty may need to be applied (e.g.: denial of Holy Communion), but there is no obligation to "remove" such mutilations. however, tattoo removal would be highly encouraged and serve as greater lesson to others. I remember reading several years ago of a "celebrity" who took his children to his painful tattoo removal sessions, taking no pain relief medication, as an example. One can only commend such action as a remedy of past and future sin.


The normal stipend for

> SUNDAYS OF FEBRUARY: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass

with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for February:

5 February 2023: Septuagesima Sunday: Commemoration of the S. Agatha, Virgin Martyr at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

12 February 2023: Sexagesima Sunday: Commemoration of Seven Holy Founders of the Servites at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

19 February 2023: Quinquagesima Sunday: Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

26 February 2023: First Sunday in Lent:

Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and For the Living and the Dead at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

TO correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the

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day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.




MASS GUILD
