LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

OR My Flesh is meat I indeed: and My Blood is drink indeed. He that eateth My Flesh, and drinketh My Blood, abideth in Me, and I in him. As the living Sather hath sent Me, and 1 live by the Father; so he that eateth Me, the same also shall live by Me. This is the Bread that came down from heaven. Not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead. He that eateth this Bread. shall live forever. - S. John 6:56-59 UR Blessed Lord, Jesus Christ, teaches disciples, and us, that He shall abide with us forever; not only spiritually as He says in S. Matthew's Gospel (18:20) but physically actually, and completely. This beautiful teaching of the Holy Church has been held since the very beginning of her foundations. S. Paul explicitly confirms this is his first letter to the Church in Corinth:

Therefore whosoever shall eat this Bread, or drink the chalice of the Lord unworthily, shall be guilty of the Body and of the Blood of the Lord. But let a man prove himself: and so let him eat of that Bread, and drink of the Chalice. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh judgment to himself, not discerning the Body of the Lord (I Corinthians 11:27-29).

The month of June has always been dedicated to the Blessed Sacrament *and* to the Sacred Heart: two devotions in honour of Our Lord that are intrinsically connected.

In both of these devotions Our Blessed Lord gives us Himself. His generosity is so deep and so profound that His love and mercy endures forever (cf. Psalm 135:1 and I Paralipomenon 16:34)!

The Lord Jesus is the font of all life and love and flows from His Most Holy and Blessed Sacrament and His Most Holy and Sacred Heart.



Pope Pius XII teaches us: The Church, rejoicing in this inestimable gift, can show forth a more ardent love of her divine Founder, and can, in a more generous and effective manner, respond to that invitation which St. John the Evangelist relates as having come from Christ Himself: "And on the last and great day of the festivity, Jesus stood and cried

out, saying, 'If any man thirst, let him come to Me, and let him drink that believeth in Me. As the Scripture saith: Out of His Heart there shall flow rivers of living waters.' Now this He said of the Spirit which they should receive who believed in Him (S. John 7:37-39)." (Haurietis Aquas no.3, 15 May 1956).

On account of this sublime teaching we come to Our Lord with confidence, believing and clinging to Him: O Jesus, meek and humble of Heart, make our hearts like unto Thine! His Heart has been opened for us, pouring forth grace and mercy, and His Body given to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament so may abide with us forever.

It is with this confidence that we of our little Oratory Chapel continue to trust in His promises and remain faithful to Him. We must remain faithful to Him and His Most Holy Catholic Church.

As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

I grew up in the *Novus* *Ordo and heard over and over that as long as a person (of any religion) followed their conscience and is "good" they can go to heaven. As I learn more and more about the authentic Catholic Faith I fear that most people go to hell. What is the real Catholic teaching about following your conscience? Thank you in advance.

Alas, many souls have been led astray by this erroneous modernist teaching. We call this error "Universal Salvation," that is, the belief that everyone will be saved and go to heaven no matter what. This is predicated upon a false notion of the mercy of God. Quite often one hears things like "How could an all loving God send anyone to hell?" or, "I don't believe in hell." First, God sends no one to hell, we "choose" it when we sin and do not repent and amend our way of life. Now as far as following one's conscience, this is only valid when one's conscience is informed and Catholic conscience. For example: attending the traditional Latin Mass at S. Francis or another Mass centre that is not part of the NewChurch, is seen by modernists as wrong or even sinful; however, our informed Catholic conscience and teaches us that receiving true, valid, and Catholic Sacraments, and attending the canonized (and perpetually legal) Catholic Mass of all ages is not only acceptable, it is the *only* legitimate means of publicly offering worship to God Almighty.

Not going to Mass on Sunday or not following an obligatory law (like those whose conscience tells them they can fornicate, use contraception, etc.) is a false and sinful misuse of their conscience; more realistically this is "convenience" rather than "conscience."

PRAYER REQUESTS




