LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

of Thy Son, wounded by our sins, dost mercifully vouchsafe to bestom upon "the infinite wealth of Thy logrant, we beseech Thee, threvering it with devotion, may fulfil our duty of wort reparation.

- Collect from the Mass of 1 Sacred Heart

REPARATION, the act making amends for a gra committed, wrong necessary component to prof devotion to the Sacred Heart Our Lord and King Jes Christ. Our Holy Father, Po Pius XI (d. 1939) teaches us: I to prayer we must also join penance, the spirit of penance, and the practice of Christian penance. Thus Our Divine Master teaches us, Whose first preaching was precisely penance: "Jesus began to preach and to say, Do penance" (S. Matthew 4:17). The same is the teaching of all Christian tradition, of the whole history of the Church. In the great calamities, in the great tribulations of Christianity, when the need of God's help was most faithful pressing, the either spontaneously, more often or following the lead and exhortations of their holy Pastors, have always taken in hand the two most mighty weapons of spiritual life: prayer and penance. By that sacred instinct, by which unconsciously as it were the Christian people is guided when not led astray by the sowers of tares, and which is none other than that "mind of Christ" (I Corinthians 2:16) of which the Apostle speaks, the faithful have

always felt immediately in such cases the need of purifying their souls from sin with contrition of heart, with the Sacrament of Penance, and of appeasing Divine Justice with external works of penance as well (Caritate Christi Compulsi, no. 22, Pius XI, 3 May 1932).



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Our Lord and King Jesus Christ is quite ancient and has at its centre two distinct objects of devotion: first is the Person of Our Lord, True God and True Man. It is not His "heart" detached from Sacred Person but what it represents: His profound love, both Human and Divine, for God and man. His entire human life was taken up by this love and since His glorious Ascension, it is taken up with our salvation and remaining in the life of His grace. The Communion of the perfected and glorified, shares in this work in imitation of the Saviour's profound love of God and man.

The second object of this devotion is reparation – what we owe God for the outrages and offences against His person and His perfect love for us, which is grievously offended my our indifference and opprobrium against Him. Remember that all sin no matter how insignificant we may think it is, is a direct offence against God Almighty. We learn from the Book of Proverbs, Six things there are, which the Lord hateth, and the seventh detesteth: Haughty eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that deviseth wicked plots, feet that are swift to run into mischief, a deceitful witness that uttereth lies, and him that soweth discord among brethren (Proverbs 6:16-9).

Yet, with all these numerous sins against Him the Lord remains gentle and benign, Peter as Blessed reminds us: Who, when He was reviled, did not revile: when He suffered, He threatened not: but delivered Himself to him that judged Him un justly. Who His own self bore our sins in His body upon the Tree: that we, being dead to sins, should live to justice: by Whose stripes you were healed (I S. Peter 2:23 – 24). No matter how greatly we have sinned against Him and how much we have misused His glorious mercy He does not durn away from us because His mercy endures forever (cf. Psalm 105:1).

Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

I know you have answered this before, but I feel I need a deeper understanding of the difference between a venial sin and a mortal sin. Thank you!

Simply put, ALL SIN is a **≁**moral evil imperfection since a voluntary act and its disorder are of the essence of sin: a venial sin is a voluntary act of a thought, word or deed in opposition to the Law of God and it impedes the attainment of man's last end (salvation) but does not deprive him from it. In its act it either consists in not fully choosing some deliberately object prohibited by the Law of God, e.g.: through negligence you forget that it is a day of obligatory fast and you eat too much at a collation (the smaller of the allowed three meals). This could be remedied by eating less at your two remaining meals (an act of reparation), but also making an act of contrition and saying extra prayers would pay back in justice for the offence. Contrariwise, a mortal sin is a fully willful and disordered act set into motion by the will from temptation, meditation and consent against the Law of God. Because the act is fully purposeful it offends Majesty and God as well as justice. A mortal sin, because it cuts us off from the grace and friendship of God, must be fully repented of and Sacramentally Confessed with the firm intention of never committing the same willful and disordered act again. These acts are delineated in the *Decalogue*, or *Ten Commandments* as well as the *Commands* of the Holy Church. To violate these Laws of God in any degree is a *mortal sin* ... it does not matter if you steal a penny or a million dollars, strike someone or murder 100 people, the *sin* is the same but the act of restoration to *justice* is different. I hope this helps.

SUNDAYS OF JUNE: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for June:

2 June May 2024: Sunday after Corpus Christi:

Commemoration of the Octave of Corpus Christi and S. Marcellinus & Companions at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

9 June 2024:

Sunday after the Sacred Heart:

Commemoration of Ss. Primus & Felician at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

16 June 2024:

Fourth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of Suffrage of the Saints and Against the Pagans at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

23 June 2024:

Fifth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of Suffrage of the Saints and Against the Pagans at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

30 June 2024:

Sixth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Paul the Apostle, S. Peter the Apostle and the Octave of S. John the Baptist at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the *Ordinary of the Mass*, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course

the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
