GRANT, O Lord, to Thy faithful people that they may begin the venerable solemnities of fasting with becoming piety, and may persevere to the end with steadfast devotion.


Collect from the Mass of Ash Wednesday

E are now firmly in Holy Lent, and our pray, penance and sacrifice must be fully in practice.

The great spiritual writer Thomas á Kempis in his work The Imitation of Christ writes: O Lord, what is man that Thou art mindful of him, or the son of man that Thou visitest him? What has man deserved that Thou should give him Thy grace? What cause have I, O Lord, to complain if Thou desert me, or what ob jection can I have if Thou dost not do what I ask? This I may think and say in all truth: "O Lord, I am nothing, of myself I have nothing that is good; I am lacking in all things, and I am ever tending toward nothing. And unless I have Thy help and am inwardly strengthened by Thee, I become quite lukewarm lax."(Book 3, Chapter 40)

This is the time to rely solely on God and His grace and mercy to overcome the habit of vice and gain the habit of virtue, but we must place ourselves, fully and without reserve, at His disposal. Only God have the power to change us and so we must place our will in His care and control,

willingly. When we do this is love and confidence then we are prepared to offer God our true and sincere gratitude for the restoration of His friendship and grace. At our recent Lenten retreat day I began teaching the faithful about justice gratitude: man owes God in justice for his disobedience and sin, but such sin was so great that it was impossible for him to ever repay, therefore only God could repay and restore the justice owed to Himself, and did so by becoming man, while retaining His Divinity. The Lord Jesus, Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity, took on our humanity in order to pay our debt, a debt we could never repay.



Besides tremendous gratitude we must offer to God a true and firm purpose amendment of our way of life. S. Thomas Aquinas teaches us that Three conditions are necessary for Penance: contrition, which is sorrow for sin, together with a purpose of amendment; confession of sins without any omission; satisfaction by means of good works. What, therefore, is a true and firm purpose of amendment? In general it is the determination

not to sin again, "Contrition requires, too, a determination not to sin again. This act of the will is a resolution to avoid all mortal sins and to take the necessary means to this end. A feeling of weakness, or a realisation from past experience that one is very likely to sin again, does not vitiate one's determination. If a man truly grieves over his sins, he has implicitly a resolution or amendment purpose ofexplicitly." (Sacramental Theology, Clarence McAuliffe, SJ, 1958, pg. 261)

Our dear seminarian is progressing well, learning his Latin, the Divine Office and other basics that shall become his daily life forever. I begin your continued prayers for him for him and all seminarians, God's grace will provide them with what they need to fulfil their vocations!

Lastly, I ask for your assistance: we must work hard for a permanent home for our Chapel, which means we need your prayers and sacrifices. ## QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Monsignor:
I have many friends who attend Mass at their home parish that offers the tradition Latin Mass and that now seems to be going away, what should these faithful Catholics do? Should they start attending the New Mass in the spirit of obedience?

• ABSOLUTELY NOT! The "New Mass" is no Mass at all, and it certainly is not Catholic. This is the problem with those who attend what they think are Masses from those "in union" with the Vatican II sect. The Holy Mass in the greatest teaching tool of the Catholic Faith, and when the Mass is divorced from the True Faith it lacks the efficacy required for true and proper worship of God Almighty.

A "Mass" offered by a priest who accepts Vatican II "doctrine and teaching" means he offers the traditional-ish Mass of 1962 in union with those who believe Catholic religions are the same as the Holy Church, that adultery and sodomy "legitimate life styles" and that abortion is "good" and that women can be ordained...now add to that belief that gender is a choice.

These pseudotraditional organisations must be abandoned immediately; the faithful must find a place for Holy Mass where the priest and the liturgy are completely and unreservedly Catholic. This may mean attending Mass in a small chapel, hotel room, home, etc. As the great S. Athanasius teaches us during the great Arian Heresy: they have the church buildings but we have the Faith!

This must serve as a lesson to all the true faithful, that is NOT the Church, because God and His Faith cannot change, EVER: Every best gift, and every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no change, nor shadow of alteration (S. James 1:17)!

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for March:

## 5 March 2023:

#### Second Sunday Lent:

Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and For the Living and the Dead at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

## 12 March 2023:

## Third Sunday in Lent:

Commemoration of S. Gregory the Great, Pope, Confessor and Doctor of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

#### 19 March 2023:

## Fourth Sunday Lent (Lætare):

Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and For the Living and the Dead at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

## 26 March 2023:

## Passion Sunday in Lent:

Commemoration Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

TO correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie,

Gloria. Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the i.e., day, Introit. Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter deeper spiritual into relationship with the Holy the Saints Liturgy, Mysteries of God.


## MASS GUILD
