FOR Christ our pasch is sacrificed. Therefore let us feast, not with the old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness; but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth! –1 Corinthians 5:7–8


In the materialistic world and secular society we find ourselves in it is easy to feel unsuccessful, however, this is not how God judges His faithful. When the Apostles were hiding in the upper room doubting everything they had believed, their guilt and fear consumed them. But in the midst of their "pity party" the Lord appeared to them:

Now when it was late that same day, the first of the week, and the doors were shut, where the disciples were gathered together, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them: Peace be to you. And when He had said this, He shewed them His hands and His side. The disciples

therefore were glad, when they saw the Lord (S. John 20:19-20).

Our Lord is recognised by His wounds; by His own will His wounds remain on His gloriously resurrected body! The perceived failure of the Lord, His Passion and ignominious death upon the Cross, becomes the way the Apostles, and we, witness His Truth: He is Lord and God!

The martyrs of our Faith have always been seen as failures by their persecutors, but our admiration of them grows exponentially when we contemplate how much they suffered on account of Christ. As the Apostle teaches us: For I think that God hath set forth us Apostles, the last, as it were men appointed to death: we are made a spectacle to the world, and to angels, and to men. We are fools for Christs sake (I Corinthians 4:9-10).





QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Monsignor: Why would God need to resurrect the bodies of the dead if the faithful are already present in heaven as spirit?

I appreciate the opportunity to clarify the Church's teaching (predicated upon Scripture) of an essential truth of our Faith.

When God created man He made him in His own Image, that is, a creature with reason who was meant to live forever. It was on account of sin that Adam and Eve, and we their children, shall die the death (Genesis 3:3 ff.). It is Our Lord Jesus Christ who confirms the Doctrine of the Bodily Resurrection of the Dead, and therefore this is how God Himself has chosen our bodily Restoration:

Martha therefore said to Jesus: Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died. But now also I know that whatsoever Thou wilt ask of God, God will give it Thee. Fesus saith to her: Thy brother shall rise again. Martha saith to Him: I know that he shall rise again, in the Resurrection at the last day. Fesus said to her: I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in Me, although he be dead, shall live: and every one that liveth, and believeth in Me, shall not die for ever. Believest thou this? She saith to Him: Yea, Lord, I have believed that Thou art Christ the Son of the living God, who art come into this world (S. John 11:21-27).

It is Our Lord Himself who teaches us that there are those who try to dissuade us from our belief in the Living God and our own bodily resurrection; in S. Luke's Gospel He warns us that they falsely teach that there is no resurrection (cf. S. Luke 20:27), and He crushes this error by teaching us that He is not the God of the dead, but of the living (S. Mark 12:27). The Apostle again reminds us that if Christ be not risen again, then is our preaching is in vain, and your faith is also in vain...but now Christ is risen from the dead, the first-fruits of them that sleep (I Corinthians 15:14, 20). The Apostle's teaching on this is so clear and so precise that only an enemy of Christ would dare to contradict it.

Lastly, call to mind the words of S. Paul: For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall be also in the likeness of His resurrection (Romans 6:5).

HOLY EASTER:

He is risen; He is not here; Behold the place where they laid Him; He is not here

THE great miracle of the Resurrection of Our Lord is so deeply profound that it requires constant thought, meditation and study. First we must understand that many people have been raised from the dead in the Scriptures; Holy Elais raises the widow of Sarephta's son (3rd Kings/I Kings 17:19 ff), and Our Lord raises the son of the widow of *Naim*'s son (S. Luke 7:11-17), the daughter of Jairus (S. Mark 5:21 ff), and most famously S. Lazarus Bethany (S. John 11), but that is the difference: they were raised but our Lord raised Himself. Because the Lord is the source of all life He has this power and ability. This act of His own volition permanently conquers death and sin forever, O death, where is thy victory? O death, where is thy sting (I Corinthians 15:55)?

Because sin and death are indeed conquered once and for all by Christ Our Risen King, we must follow Him in this re-birth, this is why the Holv Church adds Sacrament of Holy Baptism to this solemnity; because by His glorious Resurrection Christ restores us to the promise of eternal life; for as the Apostle teaches us, if we follow Christ Jesus into His death we, logically, shall follow Him into His Resurrection (cf. Romans 6:3)!

We must never forget Our Lord Himself that reminded us that there are those who try to dissuade us from our belief in the Living God and our own bodily resurrection; in S. Luke's Gospel He warns us that they falsely teach that there is no resurrection (cf. S. Luke 20:27), and He crushes this error by teaching us that He is not the God of the dead, but of the living (S. Mark 12:27). The Apostle again reminds us that if Christ be not risen again, then is our preaching is in vain, and your faith is also in vain...but now Christ is risen from the dead, the first-fruits of them that sleep (I Corinthians 15:14, 20). The Apostle's teaching on this is so clear and so precise that only an enemy of Christ would dare to contradict it.

Man was created for eternal life, and we were clearly warned by God that we were not to eat of the fruit of the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil, lest we die the death (Genesis 3:3 ff.), therefore the consequences of our disobedience was death, as the Apostle teaches us stipendia

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enim peccati mors (Romans 6:23). We must also remember that not only is death a consequence of our sin, but also certain types of suffering, specifically toil, pain and subjection (cf. Genesis 3:16-19).

However, with this deserved divine and punishment God gives us hope and promises mercy for those who will repent, convert and conform to His plan for us: a Redeemer Whose supreme act has restored us to the friendship and favour of God. It is also important to remember that God continuously spares us, wicked and unprofitable sinners; for example, when Abraham is commanded that he should sacrifice his only son, Isaac, yet at the last moment God sends His angel and stays Abraham's hand: lay not thy hand upon the boy, neither do thou any thing to him: now I know that thou fearest God, and hast not spared thy only begotten son for My sake (Genesis 22:12). Yet God spares not His own Son, allowing sinners to lay violent hands upon Him. Christ Our Paschal Lamb lays down His life for our sake in order to God's offended appease ma jesty.

God knows our weakness and frailty, and constantly gives us aid, which is the main purpose of the institution and administration of the Holy Sacraments, most especially the Sacraments of the Dead, Baptism and Confession: so called because they give grace and life to our souls which are dead in Providentially God affords us the many, oft undeserved, chances to be restored to His

grace. When I think about these many chances I call to mind the lesson of our holy Father Abraham who bargained with God over the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah: God would spare the wicked if Abraham could find 50 righteous men, then forty-five, then thirty, then twenty, then finally ten...not unlike to nagging widow and the unjust judge in Our Lord's parable: Although I fear not God, nor regard man, yet because this widow is troublesome to me, I will avenge her, lest continually coming she weary me (S. Luke 18:5). He heard her cause to be rid of her, but how loving a God have we Who hears our cause because He loves us!

Lastly, do let us everything possible to retain our Easter joy, even in the midst of the perception of suffering, remembering the Apostle's admonishment: the suffering of the present is not worthy of the glory to come (Romans 8:18)! Always hold to the promise of the Lord, Who remains with us and sustains us: Deus providebit. Let us follow the example of Our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Sorrows. Her sorrow is for the great suffering of her Son...she was not sorrowful for herself, for she knew a sword would pierce her own soul (cf. S. Luke 2:35).





CATECHISM FOR ALL

TE had a very successful year with our catechumens going through the entire Roman Catechism (often called the Catechism of the Council or Trent) as they prepared to be Baptised and enter the Holy Church. They will, of course, continue to prepare for the reception of the Sacraments of Holy Confirmation and Holy Communion.

In the past we held lectures on the Holy Faith, however, without having a place to regularly hold those lectures we will proceed with them via an email list. Once a month a lecture will be sent to all the participants on a mailing list, then they may respond by sending their questions and comments: those questions and comments will be returned to the participants before the next lecture.

What is truly exciting about this series will be the ability to have more guest lecturers than in the past since they do not have to travel to southern California.


BTW: There are still several open dates in May for Masses.
