LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun, terrible as an army set in array? — Canticles 6:9

Our BLESSED LORD gives us His very own Mother from His Cross: Behold thy Mother (S. John 19:27), and like the Beloved Disciple we must take her to our own (ibid.). Such a wondrous and mystical gift must be gratefully and lovingly embraced; Our Lady is our greatest advocate before Our Lord, her Son and Saviour, and if we would simply follow her request: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye (S. John 2:5).

In his exquisite Papal Bull *Dominici Gregis* (3 February 1603) Pope Clement VII (d. 1605) extols the virtues of Our Lady as a remedy to societal ills, and truly if we would simply acquiesce to numerous requests to repent, convert, pray and live lives of grace that please God all the evil of this world would simply disappear, however, man in his sinful arrogance remains aloof to Our Blessed Lady's call to turn towards Christ and away from the devil.

Our Lady's role as *Mother* and *Advocate* is powerful and all of heaven heeds her requests for our assistance to attain heaven, as S. Basil the

Great (d. 379) writes: O sinner, be not discouraged, but have recourse to Mary in all your necessities. Call her to your assistance, for such is the divine Will that she should help in every kind of necessity, and S. John Vianney (d. 1859), says further: If you invoke the Blessed Virgin when you are tempted, she will come at once to your help, and Satan will leave you.



We must take devotion and recourse to Our Lady beyond mere piety, our love for the Holy Mother of God must be tangible and witnessed before all men. The secular world likes to say that May is the month of mothers and includes many individuals who are not mothers, neither biologically nor spiritually, but merely in some form of unnatural sentimental regard; this must be combatted as it degrades and lessens the truth motherhood womanhood. Calling a thing what it is not does not change its nature, it does not make it so. We must protect the nature

of women and motherhood, which then protects the nature of the family and all of human society, both naturally and supernaturally.

Praise God for creating man in His own likeness and image, thus giving him a nature that is unique and distinct from all other creatures, and then giving him two distinct and unique forms, male and female, that are complimentary to one another. Without the proper and well-ordered nature of male and female human society would cease to exist; but ultimately such an attack cannot conquer humanity, as God will not allow the total self-annihilation of wicked creature though he be; because, again turning back to Our Lady, we know that God shall gloriously conquer through her, as she says: In the end my Immaculate Heart shall triumph!

Again I ask all who read this little newsletter to continue to keep in your prayers our need for a permanent home for our little Oratory Chapel; fancy is not needed, just sturdy and welcoming, where Our Lord and King may dwell and His servants can adore Him with reverence and devotion. May He reign in our hearts, minds and souls forever!

Monsignor Sebastian:
When our time to die comes or our instincts indicate, having perfect contrition is a must whether or not a Priest is at our bedside: is this correct?



Perfect Contrition is the complete and satisfactory abhorrence of sin and the firm purpose to never commit sin again. The Catholic Encyclopedia teaches this: "The Council of Trent (Sess. XIV, Chap. iv) has defined contrition as "sorrow of soul, and a hatred of sin committed, with a firm purpose of not sinning in the future". This hatred of sin may arise from various motives, may be prompted by various causes. The detestation of sin arises from the love of God, Who has been grievously offended, then contrition is termed perfect;" then teaches further, "if it arise from any other motive, such as loss of heaven, fear of hell, or the heinousness of guilt, then it is termed *imperfect* contrition."

Whether or not a Priest may be by our side at a grave illness or death we must always have a proper contrition for our sins and a firm purpose of amendment, i.e.: to avoid sin in the future. Let us also be sure to not wait until we are close to death to have sorrow for our sins, sacramentally confess them and then remain in God's grace: let us be aware of the state of our soul as well as the Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell.

1 May 2022:

Saints Philip & James:

Commemoration of the Second Sunday after Easter at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

8 May 2022:

Third Sunday after Easter:

Commemoration of the Apparition of S. Michael the Archangel and the Sunday within the Octave of the Solemnity of S. Joseph at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

15 May 2022:

Fourth Sunday after Easter:

Commemoration of S. John the Baptist de la Salle at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

22 May 2022:

Fifth Sunday after Easter:

Commemoration of Our Lady and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

29 May 2022:


Sunday within the Octave of the Ascension:

Commemoration of S. Mary Magdalen del Pazzi and Within the Octave at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive

early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, and Communion Verse Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
