
LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

And making a gathering, he sent twelve thousand drachms of silver to Jerusalem for sacrifice to be offered for the sins of the dead, thinking well and religiously concerning the resurrection, (for if he had not hoped that they that were slain should rise again, it would have seemed superfluous and vain to pray for the dead,) And because he considered that they who had fallen asleep with godliness, had great grace laid up for them. It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins. - 11 Waccabees 12:43 - 46

HE Holy doctrine opraying for the Holy Souls Purgatory is confirmation of God's mercy and justice: those who die in God's grace immediately receive His plentiful mercy by being allowed return what they owe in justice for their forgiven sins. The comparison of a criminal repentant being pardoned by the court as long as he returns what he originally stole to its proper owner, as the Angelic Doctor, S. Thomas Aquinas, teaches: res clamat ad dominum (a thing cries out for its owner).

The Twenty-Fifth Session of the Council of Trent concerning Purgatory (3 & 4 December 1563) solemnly teaches: Since the Catholic Church, instructed by the Holy Ghost, in conformity with the

sacred writings and the ancient tradition of the Fathers in Sacred Councils, and very recently in this Ecumenical Synod, has taught that there is a Purgatory, and that the souls detained there are assisted by the suffrages of the faithful, and especially by the acceptable Sacrifice of the Altar, the holy Synod commands the Bishops that they insist that the sound doctrine of Purgatory, which has been transmitted by the holy Fathers and holy Councils, be believed by the faithful of Christ, maintained, taught, and everywhere preached.



The pious practice for offering sacrifice and prayers for our beloved dead, who have died in the grace of Sacraments, is not praiseworthy, but necessary for the expiation of what souls owe in justice, and those who are freed by our prayers are our eternal friends, for there is no such thing as an ungrateful holy soul! I beg everyone to teach their families, most especially their children, to pray for the dead. Holy Grace before Meals and After Meals is the easiest way to build the holy habit; at the end of each simply add, while making the Sign of the Cross: May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Simple, easy and teaches this sublime doctrine in the most natural of ways. If we do not teach by example the pious practice of praying for the Holy Souls, who will pray for our souls when we die? Will there be anyone to light candles, pray novenas or have Holy Mass offered for the expiation of our own souls?

Use your family prayer as a means of sanctifying grace and a means of teaching; I learned the Holy Faith kneeling with my grandparents for the family Rosary – my grandfather led and my grandmother and I followed: this is family prayer well ordered. We can see S. Joseph leading the Holy Family in prayer, because Our Blessed Lord was sub ject to His foster-father (cf. S. Luke 2:51); for true authority begins with true obedience.

Lastly, as always, I recommend the reading of the wonderful book by the Jesuit Father *Francis Xavier Schouppe* entitled *Purgatory* for the month of November. It is one of the most splendid resources on the subject of the Holy Souls.



As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

My Lord Sebastian:

I get confused when I read certain things about Our Lord; was He born with full knowledge of all things or did the human part of Him learn as He grew? St. Luke said that "He advanced in wisdom, and age and grace with God and man". Humbly,

↑That powerful question that has provoked much speculation over the centuries from nontheologians. When S. Luke wrote his Gospel he did so with highly educated Greek, and it was written with great majesty and theological poetry. The sentence you inquire of reads this: Kaì like Ίησοῦς προέκοπτε σοφία καὶ ἡλικία καὶ χάριτι παρὰ Θεῷ καὶ ἀνθρώποις; which is less idiomatic then the Latin: Et Iesus proficiebat sapientia, et ætate, et gratia apud Deum et homines. Proper reading in Greek and Latin, which employ mood (the use of verbal inflections) much more than English, gives us a better understanding of what the Holy Evangelist is teaching, e.g.: As Jesus grew older He constantly manifested to others a greater wisdom and grace (here meaning favour and theological grace). Think of the Transfiguration of the Lord; His appearance did not change, rather, His chosen Disciples were able to perceive Him closer to His perfect reality.

Thank you for the very good question, which I hope will inspire others to ask such questions for our future editions!

8 December 2021 (Wednesday)
Feast of the Immaculate
Conception of the BVM
25 December 2021 (Saturday)
Feast of the Nativity of the Lord

SUNDAYS OF NOVEMBER: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for November:

7 November 2021: Twenty-Fourth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of Octave of All Saints at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

14 November 2021: Twenty-Fifth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Josaphat at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

21 November 2021: Last Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of the Presentation of the BVM at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion, and Last Gospel.

28 November 2021: First Sunday in Advent:

Commemoration of Our Lady in Advent, and Against the Persecutors of the Holy Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the

prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
