LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

GOD, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful, grant to the souls of Chy departed servants and handmaids the remission of all their sins, that through our devout prayers they may obtain the pardon which they have always desired.

Collect from the first Mass of the Commemoration of the Saithful Departed

****HE** necessity of praying for the souls of those who have God's died in grace paramount because it has the Theological Virtue of Charity (cf. I Corinthians 13:13) as its object. Man's proper and wellordered supernatural love of his fellow man (cf. S. Matthew 19:19) is the natural (and supernatural) reaction to the perfect love of God. This wellordered "circle" is understood as the Communion of the Saints, that the spiritual connectivity that binds the souls of the faithful on earth (the Church Militant), (the Church purgatory Suffering) and in heaven (the Church Triumphant). This connectivity relies on the virtue of charity to support, assist and encourage the members of the Church Militant in meeting their final end, salvation; as well as aiding the souls in purgatory towards

the perfection of their souls and the relief of their suffering of what they owe in justice.

The concept of justice is often misunderstood and even Our Lord had to correct His disciples on its proper understanding application, Seek ye therefore first the Kingdom of God, and His justice, and all these things shall be added unto you (S. Matthew 6:33): it is God's justice that we seek, which is ob jective and infinite. For example, if one steals \$20.00 dollars from someone, and repents and seeks forgiveness from the one robbed and is in fact forgiven, the restitution of what was stolen is still owed in justice.



When we seek sacramental absolution we must first make a firm purpose of amendment, i.e.: to never commit that same sin again, and then we are given an act of penance to restore what God is owed in justice by our sin. This may be prayers or an act of

sacrifice or charity that must be performed. If one fails to complete this act of penance in a timely manner, or at all, the validity of their Confession may be called into question. This is how justice is understood in the Catholic moral sense.

Since the Holy Souls in Purgatory are unable to assist themselves it is our obligation of charity to pray and sacrifice on their behalf, that being said, it is also our duty to teach others about this act of charity so that there will always be those who will heroically pray and sacrifice for these souls – if fail in this latter consideration, who, pray tell, shall pray and sacrifice for our soul when the need arises? Now the greatest prayer and sacrifice for the souls in purgatory is, of course, the offering of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass; this perfect and most efficacious act offers perfect worship, honour and thanksgiving to God on behalf of the needy soul and will provide that soul relief by the application of the fruits of Holy Mass.

As always, be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

Is it a sin to allow my children to listen to "bad" music?

First we have to define A what you mean by "bad" music: if we strictly speak of the particular quality of composition, that is simply predicated upon one's subjective preference, e.g.: Classical vs. Popular vs. Country vs. Cultural Traditional music and the like. In this case there is no moral issue concerning a composition being "good or bad". Now, in regard to the "content" or "theme" of said composition, that can indeed be considered "bad" and morally objectionable. This is why certain operas were objectionable because they romanticised infidelity, adultery, substance abuse, murder and the like. It is the same for contemporary music, which may seem quite lovely in its composition and style, but the theme of its lyrics are completely immoral and diabolical. This makes such music even more dangerous because it is pleasant to hum or sing along with, so we neglect or simply do not care how wicked the theme is.

Ultimately if we instill, from and early age, the love of good and wholesome music (and other entertainments) in our children, then we will help them grow in finding proper happiness (cf. Ephesians 5:19, Colossians 3:16).

SUNDAYS OF NOVEMBER: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for September:

3 November 2024: Forth Sunday after the Epiphany:

Commemoration of *Octave of All Saints* at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

10 November 2024:
Fifth Sunday after the Epiphany:

Commemoration of S. Andrew of Avelino, Confessor and S. Tryphon & Companions, Martyrs, at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

17 November 2024: Sixth Sunday after the Epiphany:

Commemoration of S. Gregory Thuumaturgus, Bishop & Confessor, and the Suffrage of the Saints at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

24 November 2024: Last Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. John of the Cross, Confessor & Doctor of the Church and S. Chrysogomus, Martyr at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

TO correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of i.e., Introit. the day, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Secret Collect, and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.


