LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

FOR she by her seed has crushed the head of the twisted serpent, and has alone destroyed all heresies, and by the blessed fruit of her womb has saved a world condemned by the fall of our first parent. From her, without human hand, was that stone cut, which, struck by wood, poured forth the abundantly flowing waters of graces. – *Consueverunt Romani*, S. Pope Pius V, 17 September 1569

OCTOBER is traditionally the month of the Holy Rosary, as well as the of the Kingship of Our Lord (last Sunday in October. This month also commemorates the 100th Anniversary of the *Miracle of the Sun* at Fatima, Portugal (a wondrous anniversary) and, alas, the 500th anniversary of Luther's revolt and revolution. Modernists in NewRome mostly ignore the former and "hail" the latter. Why? Because they are no longer Catholic, plain and simple.

To the modernist Marian devotion is an hold-over from the past, an embarrassment for the simple minded and superstitious. Remember when Francis of Rome was told people were "praying the Rosary for his intentions" (over 3,500 Rosaries) he sneered at that

saying *that sort of thing* was "a return to disciplines, to things that in that moment took place, but not now, they do not exist today." Just quoting for your information...

The Holy Rosary is a powerful spiritual tool that helps the soul grow in grace by meditating upon the mystical and salvific life of Our Lord, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, His mother. But for the modernist, who *considers things* in his own mind rather than contemplating upon God and our grace filled spiritual life in union with Him is just too passé .



Devotion to the Mother of God is a pious and profitable thing: who can doubt the efficacy of asking her intercession before the Triune and Majestic Throne of God? Why would God deny her anything when she denied Him

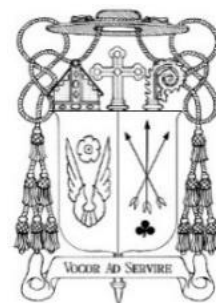
nothing, giving Him her own self and making a sacrificial oblation of her own Son? Pope Leo XIII teaches us that "This devotion, so great and so confident, to the august Queen of Heaven, has never shone forth with such brilliancy as when the militant Church of God has seemed to be endangered by the violence of heresy spread abroad, or by an intolerable moral corruption, or by the attacks of powerful enemies." (*Supremi Apostolatus Officio*, 1 September 1883, no.3).

The Holy Father, Pope Leo, could not be more prophetic for indeed the **Church Militant** is truly under siege by the *violence of heresy* and *intolerable moral corruption*. We must, dearest in Christ, seek the immediate protection of Our Blessed Lady, the *Lady of the Rosary*. Let us all renew our fervour by pious and devout recitation of the Most Holy Rosary!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q. As a first-time visitor to S. Francis I was impressed by the genuine faith and devotion of the people and the clergy. Everything was very beautiful; but my question is: why was the ceremony entirely in Latin? Do you think more people would come if part of the service was in English? God bless you all! A. Welcome to S. Francis and many thanks for your question. For those who have grown up outside of the Catholic Church the Latin can be beautiful and even "mysterious" sounding but also off-putting. Latin is the "official" Liturgical language of the Western (Latin Right Church). There are other Liturgical Languages in the Catholic Church, including Greek, Armenian, Syriac and Coptic (to name just a few). These languages survive in official Catholic Liturgies in their ancient (classical) forms because they do not change in their meanings. Of these languages Latin, Greek and Hebrew are considered Sacred (holy and set apart).

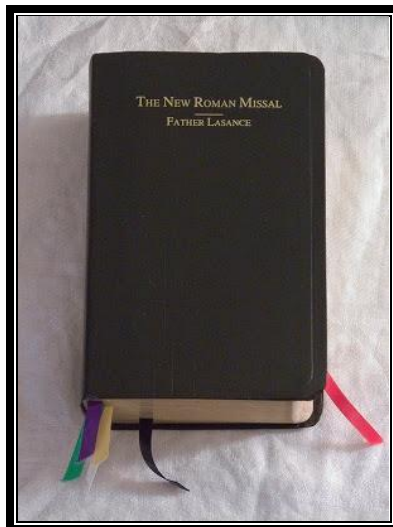
Liturgical language is for the solemn worship of God and therefore cannot change. For example Liturgical Hebrew used in Jewish worship is quite different from the modern Hebrew spoken today in Israel. The same applies for those who pray in Arabic.

Those faithful to Catholic tradition stand firm in

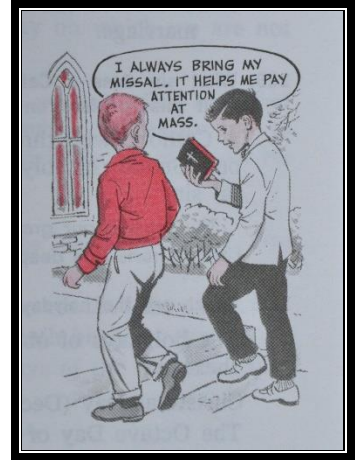
the need for the Sacred Liturgy to remain in its purest form, i.e. : Latin. Until the disastrous "changes" to the Sacred Liturgy in the mid-twentieth century any Catholic could travel to any place and have a full understanding of the Mass, thereby have the full ability to pray and worship God, as did his forefathers before him.

By frequent attendance and some assistance a layman in the pew learns much of the Latin by rote and with purposeful effort can actually learn the Latin to a greater degree. Also available to the faithful are traditional Hand Missals that display the official Latin text of the Mass with its corresponding vernacular translation on the adjoining page.

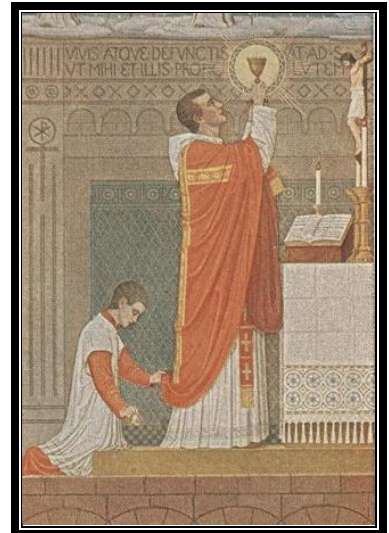

OUR LADY OF FATIMA: 100 YEARS

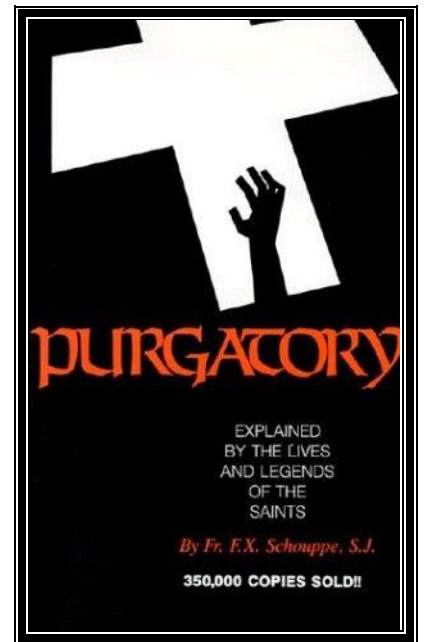
WHO is she that cometh forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun, terrible as an army set in array? – Canticles 6:9

BOOK REVIEW: PURGATORY

NEXT month, November, is the month dedicated to the Holy Souls: a powerful and most necessary Catholic devotion. A Religious gave me a copy of Father Schouppe's

Purgatory in the early 1990's and it profoundly changed my understanding and increased my devotion to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Growing up in an Irish Catholic family we always prayed for the Holy Souls (one decade in Latin at the end of the family Rosary) and lit candles, and the like, but it was not until reading this book did I realize that I had *a duty* to pray for the Holy Souls and make devotion to them known.

This is why we have the Poor Souls Shrine erected every November as well as the Novena of Masses for their intentions. I one learned from this book, there is no such thing as an ungrateful Holy Soul: help in the relief of a Holy Soul and you have a special Saint in heaven praying (and looking out) for you!

The beautiful stories from this book help deepen our understanding of the Holy Souls and of Purgatory itself (referred to as the **Church Suffering**) with several chapters devoted to the Church's teaching as well as actual stories from the lives of the saints. At just a little over 300 pages this book is perhaps the best reference resource on Purgatory and the devotion to the Holy Souls.

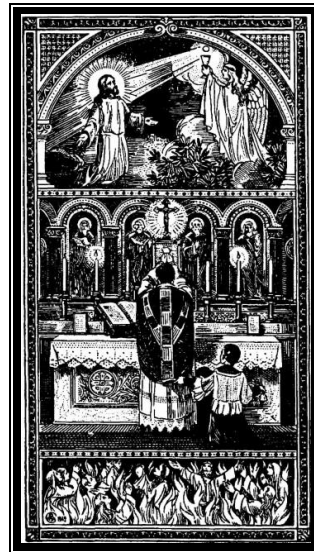
