# LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

SOD, Whose Only-Begotten Son, by His Life, his Death and his Resurrection hath purchased for us the remard of eternal salvation; grant, we beseech Thee, that meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may both imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise; through the same Christ Our Lord.

**THE** month of October is traditionally the month of the Holy Rosary, and the need for our recourse to beautiful prayer and devotion is paramount today's in dangerous and evil climate. S. Dominic used this prayer and devotion to combat the heresies the Albigensians, erroneously believed everything material (created) including the humanity of the Lord Jesus, is evil, and everything spiritual is good. This is often called neo-Manichaeism, which was an early heresy of dualism. The Holy Rosary brought about the conversion of many of these heretics. The Rosary was of course also used to stave off the Turkish attackers at the Battle of Lepanto (1571) when Don Juan of Austria (d. 1578) with outnumbered the vastly

Catholic were victorious. Pope S. Pius V instituted the feast of Our Lady the Rosary commemoration of that day (7 October). The Holy Rosary is a powerful spiritual tool that helps the soul grow in grace by meditating upon the mystical and salvific life of Our Lord, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, His mother. I do not believe there has been a saint raised to the dignity of the Altar within the past fifteen-hundred years that did not recite Our Lady's Rosary every day.



When we pray the Holy Rosary we must do so with great piety, reverence and attention, we must refrain from what Our Lord tells us is the vain repetitions of the pagans (cf. S. Matthew 6:7); instead we meditate upon Mystery set before us. When we are preparing to meditate upon the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary we have to first remove ourselves from distractions such as other people, the television or radio, and of course, our mobile phones and devices. We should then set our minds with the intention of the

meditation – remember that meditation is a higher form of prayer and therefore we will profit more from it. S. Thomas Aquinas (d. 1274), the Angelic Doctor, teaches us that when we meditate upon God we are most like Him, because God is always in perfect union with Himself. Meditation is also the prayer in which we listen to God.

We begin by focusing on a particular Mystery of the Holy Rosary the use of an image can be highly effective; When I pray the Holy Rosary I still think of the images from my childhood hand missal, even to this day. When meditating upon the Sorrowful Mysteries I often call to mind images from the film The Passion of the Christ. With such meditation upon the Life, Death and Resurrection of Our Blessed Lord in union with the earthly life of Our Lady, we are guaranteed to live a life truly holy, well-ordered and spiritually meritorious!

I echo my prayer intention for you from last month's newsletter: may Our Blessed Lady continue to watch over you all, and may she cover you in her mantle of maternal love and peace.

As always, be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

No, not at all, that is total modernism - and it is a canonical crime and act of heresy called communicatio in sacris: e.g.: It is clear that the Apostolic See cannot on any terms take part in their assemblies [of non-Catholics], nor is it anyway lawful for Catholics either to support or to work for such enterprises; for if they do so they will be giving countenance to a false Christianity, quite alien to the one Church of Christ. - Pius XI, Mortalium Animos, no. 8, 6 Fanuary 1928 and from Canon Law: It is not licit for the faithful by any manner to assist actively or to have a part in the sacred rites of non-Catholics (Canon 1258 §1)

I am very sorry that your poor friend was misled, but the sin is not his since he acted in good faith seeking counsel of a Priest, who really should know better. Let us pray for the conversion of this Priest so that he no longer guides people into sin and error.

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for September:

#### 6 October 2024:

Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Bruno, Confessor at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

13 October 2024:

Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Edward, Confessor and King, and the Suffrage of the Saints at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

20 October 2024:

Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. John Cantius, Confessor and for the Propagation of the Faith at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

#### 27 October 2024:

#### Christ the King:


Commemoration of the Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day. i.e., Introit. Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect. Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
