LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR


DEARLY Beloved, let us love one another, for charity is of God. And every one that loveth, is born of God, and knoweth God. – 15. John 4:7

SAINT Thomas Aquinas teaches us that zeal is a necessary effect of love, being the vehement movement of one who loves to [secure] the object of his love (cf. Summa Theol. I-II:28:4). When God is the object of our love our souls are vivified with charity (the supernatural love of God) and in turn we then can love others as a reflection of our love of God.

As Christians we are commanded by Our Saviour to love one another, as He loves us (cf. S. John 13:34). He then tells us that By this shall all men know that you are My disciples, if you have love one for another (ibid.).

We must never confuse this perfect love as a mere "preference" another for person, for being perfected by grace it is above such a thing. When we have Apostolic Zeal we love any and all people on account of God rather than on account of them simply as persons. We do not love others because they are nice, or pleasant or attractive: we love them for no other reason than they are created in the likeness and image of God. Remember that God created us for Himself, as S. John tells us in his Apocalypse: Thou art worthy, O Lord our God, to receive glory, and honour, and power: because Thou hast created all things; and for Thy will they were, and have been created (Apoc. 4:11).

Our Lord teaches us that we are to follow God's example of love for one another with purity and desire for that person's sanctification: this love of souls is Apostolic Zeal.



I am often shocked at hearing from traditionalists how evil this or that person is, or how this or that person *must* be condemned rather than being prayed for...Our Lord tells us this is wrong in no uncertain terms: You have heard that it hath been said, thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thy enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies: do good to them that hate you: and pray for them that persecute and calumniate you: That you may be the children of your Father who is in heaven, who maketh His sun to rise upon the good, and bad, and raineth upon the just and the un just. For if you love them that love you, what reward shall you have? do not even the publicans do this? And if you salute your brethren only, what do you more? do not also the heathens do this? Be you therefore perfect, as also your heavenly Father is perfect (S. Matthew 5:43-48).

God is *love* and God is *perfect*, and therefore, if we are to be as *perfect as Our Heavenly*

Father, a perfection to which we are called (it is the true Christian Vocation) and we must show that perfect love to others – not in a human way, but, rather, in an holy way.

There is too much anger and hate in this world for us to add our own sinful anger. We must seek to show the world Our Lord and King by our holy example: we must do good.

One way that we here at our little Oratory can do good is to host a Blood Drive with the American Red Cross. We are hoping to do this in the fall. Once a date is secured we can spread the word and get our community involved, perhaps even have other traditional Chapels involved as well. Please pray for this intention.

Lastly, I beg for your prayers as I begin my twentieth year of serving you and our Holy Church as a Catholic Bishop.

As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass. I remain,

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Recently I attended a Catholic funeral and I was quite surprised to learn that after the Mass the person was to be cremated. I thought this was forbidden? Can I get an authentic clarification?

Oh dear! Let be begin by confirming your thought: the Holy Church indeed condemns the cremation of her faithful departed under normal circumstances. Canon 1203 of the 1918 Code of Canon Law specifically states:

§1. The bodies of the faithful departed shall be buried, their cremation being reprobated (forbidden).

§2. If anyone by any manner orders that his body be cremated, it is illicit to execute that desire; and if this was added to any contract or testament or any other act it is considered as not being added.


Now in times of war, plague and pestilence the cremation of large groups of the dead was tolerated for fear of contagion, but this was an exception and the Church made sure that there was no appearance of indifference or denial of the Resurrection of Dead.

The general move towards cremation today is simply out of "convenience" and economy; and therefore always illicit.

Also, rather than thinking it "dark" or "morbid", families should have mature spiritual conversations about their funeral plans; preparing and saving money for such an eventuality is prudent and absolutely Catholic.

BOOK REVIEW:
RESTORING
THE FAMILY
BY MARIAN T.
HORVAT, PH.D.

THIS excellent book is not new, it became available in 2003. I originally purchased a dozen copies and gave them to our parishioners with small children. Over the years I have referred to it from the pulpit and recommended it to other traditional clergy.

The author, Marian T. Horvat, Ph.D., is no stranger to the traditional movement, many may know her name from the *outstanding* website Tradition In Action (one of the several recommended websites

found in this newsletter) of which she is a founder.

The book is not a long or complicated read (indeed, it can be read at one sitting), but filled with resources that are not only founded on the True Religion, but correct society, politics and finance. It has four chapters and a Conclusion: The Reconstitution of the Family and the Need for Tradition (I), The Family Patrimony (II), Paternal Authority Maternal Piety (III), Three Great Social Laws: Authority, Hierarchy, Union (IV).

The restoration of the family is indeed an uphill battle, but when sought with common sense, information and the grace of God it is not only "do-able", it can and will be accomplished. This book is not only for families with small children, but for even grandparents who wish to influence their families return to the normalcy of Catholic Society. We must never become discouraged by the clamour of the evil that surrounds us and our families: the True Faith, True Mass and True Sacraments are, as always, our only authentic remedy, and this begins with establishment (or reestablishment) of family traditions, e.g.: the Sunday Family Dinner, the Family Rosary, the Family Mass, etc., to quote from the book:

A guarantee of a people's greatness and stability is their respect for traditions, noted Pope Pius XII in a 1957 speech. This respect, he said, means keeping alive what the centuries have proven to be fruitful (Address to professors and students of the Liceo Ennio Quirino Visonti

of Rome, February 28, 1957). Tradition is more than keeping religious feast days and the healthy customs that give unity to a people. It is to follow the moral values and guiding principles that the Catholic Faith instilled in the conscience of a people throughout its history. To respect tradition means to guarantee the moral life of a people (p.13).
