LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is just. Honour thy father and thy mother, which is the first commandment with a promise: That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest be long lived upon earth. And you, fathers, provoke not your children to anger; but bring them up in the discipline and correction of the Lord. — Ephesians 6:1 – 4

THE Catholic Family is a precious commodity, for from it comes more catholic families, and the true jewel of the Church: vocations.

It is natural that parents are reluctant to give their children over to the Church. There is certain fear that they are "losing" them; a mother once said to me, "I would rather my son risk his life in war than waste it as a Priest." Even the most devout Catholic parents don't want their children to follow their vocations, somehow fearing it anomalous, which in reality, it is. Family life is quite holy and natural, but to correspond to a vocation is supernatural, and therefore much more difficult (and more meritorious) pursue.

Our Blessed Mother understands this which makes her a suitable patroness of parents who have children with Priestly or Religious vocations.

When Our Lady, accompanied by Blessed Joseph, presented Our Lord in the Temple, Holy Simeon the Prophet said to her: Behold this Child is set for the fall, and for the resurrection of many in Israel, and for a sign which shall be contradicted; And thy own soul a sword shall pierce, that, out of many hearts, thoughts may be revealed (S. Luke 2:34-35). In the ancient Marian devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary this is the First Sorrow.

Our Lady is a perfect example of offering back to God the precious lives of our children. It is the greatest act of acknowledging the generosity of God, Who tells us through the Holy Prophet Malachias: Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in My House, and try Me in this, saith the Lord: if I open not unto you the flood-gates of heaven, and pour you out a blessing even to abundance (Malachias 3:10).

In this case it is our children who become the tithe offering. My mother used to

tell me a story that when I was only a few months old I was very sick with the pneumonia (the beginning of my breathing issues) and she took me to the hospital chapel and offered me to God, through S. Joseph, if He would spare my life. As much as she wanted me to get married and have a family, she impeded my vocation...she kept her promise, and God kept His.

Our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Sorrows, gave her precious Son, Our Lord and King Jesus Christ, back to God, most especially when she stood beneath His Cross and shared in His offering.

Will the parents reading this follow her most holy example? I hope and pray so. The task of forming young men to become Another Christ is time consuming and costly (not just monetarily) and requires generosity great by concerned, especially from Catholic parents. As much as we may give, we must remember that God gave first, and of His choicest: For God so loved the world, as to give His only begotten Son; that whosoever believeth in Him, may not perish, but may have life everlasting (S. John 3:16)

As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

at the Collect, Secret and
Postcommunion.

8 September 2019: Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary: commemoration of the 13th Sunday after Pentecost then S. Hadrian at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary: commemoration of the 14th Sunday after Pentecost then S. Nicomedes at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.


22 September 2019: 15th Sunday after Pentecost: commemoration of S. Thomas Villanova then S. Maurice & Companions at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

29 September 2019: Dedication of S. Michael the Archangel: commemoration of Saint Francis Exchange
16th Sunday after Pentecost at
the Collect, Secret and
Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Creed, Sanctus, Gloria, Benedictus, Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass. and the Propers of the Mass, those which very according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holv Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.


