LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

EVOTION to the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows is quite ancient; by the early thirteenth century the Servite Order (Ordo Servorum Beatae Mariae Virginis) of Religious was established with the specific devotion of Our Lady of Sorrows and have championed the establishment of several feasts of Our Lady under that The Seven title. Dolors (Sorrows) of Our Lady are:

- the prophecy of Simeon(S. Luke 2:34 – 35)
- ♦ the flight into Egypt (S. Matthew 2:13 15)
- ❖ losing the Holy Child at Jerusalem (S. Luke 2:43 - 5○)
- meeting the Lord Jesus on His way to Calvary
 (S. John 19:25 - 27)
- standing at the foot of the Cross (*ibid*)
- ❖ Christ being taken from the Cross (S. John 19:38 40)
- the burial of Christ (ibid)

When speaking of Our Lady of Sorrows we must always be sure to remind the faithful of how Our Lady

suffered; so different from how you and I, sinners, suffer. Our suffering is on account of sin, Original and actual, however, Our Blessed Mother suffered in a spiritual manner and is unique because she is not suffering any physical suffering from sickness or pain. When she the mysterious received prophecy of Blessed Simeon or experienced the sorrow and grief when searching for the Christ Child in the Temple in Jerusalem it was a mystical suffering coupled with emotional concern (not an emotional suffering).



At the Passion Death of Our Blessed Lord she indeed suffered, spiritually and emotionally as she witnessed the horrific torture of her natural Son of the flesh, and that was coupled with her suffering for what was happening to God by those whom He came to redeem. This latter suffering exceeded all her other suffering, both natural and supernatural: for her pure love and fidelity to

God would have felt this wound to the greatest, most profound and severe manner ever experienced by another human person; hence the opinion that by such suffering Our Lady was our Co-Redemptrix.

important consideration of the devotion of Our Lady of Sorrows is of her great fidelity: while so many others, including those closest to Our Blessed Lord, even His chosen Rock that His Holy Church would be built upon, hid out of fear (cf. S. John 20:19), she and the Disciple whom Our Lord loved (cf. ibid 19:26) stood firm at the Cross. Our Lady's heart is not only immaculate but so is her purpose and strength; she is for us the greatest example of perfect love of God, no other consideration save that great love.

When we pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary we must unite our prayers to those of Our Blessed Lady and accompany Our Saviour of His journey towards His Passion and Death so that we, like Our Lady, might share in the pure joy of His glorious Resurrection!

As always, I am most grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured of my paternal benediction and prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

The Holy Father, S. EMBER DAYS OF SEPTEMBER

Please remember In that this month we observe the **Ember Days** September: Wednesday the 21st, Friday the 23rd and Saturday the 24th. The Holy Church devotes these days to penance and prayer, sacrifice. On these three days the faithful are bound, under pain of mortal sin, to abstain from meat.

The current Laws of Fast and Abstinence (for the United States) are absolutely binding (unless lawfully excused or dispensed) for all the faithful. All baptised Catholics, seven years of age or older, are bound to abstain. The two types of abstinence are complete and partial. Complete abstinence forbids the eating of meat, and soup or gravy made with or from meat is required all Fridays throughout the year, Partial Abstinence, which permits meat, and soup or gravy made from meat, to be eaten only at the main meal, is required on Ember Wednesday and Ember Saturday.

The laws of **Fasting** are for all baptised Catholics, from ages 21 through 59, inclusive. On the days of fast only one full meal is allowed (with meat, except on Friday) with two smaller *meatless* meals, which together do not

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equal one full meal. The eating of food or snacks between meals is forbidden; however the drinking of liquids, including milk and juice, are allowed.

For reasons of health one may seek the reduction or even dispensation from the fast from the Monsignor; one should never simply dispense one's self from these obligations; and should one be lawfully dispensed from these obligations, he should strive to find another type of approved penance that can be satisfactory to Almighty God.

SUNDAYS OF SEPTEMBER: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for September:

4 September 2022:

Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

11 September 2022:

Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Protus & Hyacinth and the Suffrage of the Saints at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

18 September 2022:

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Foseph Cupertino at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

25 September 2022:

Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of the Suffrage of the Saints and Against the Persecutors of the Church at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with

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the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.




