LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

EVOTION to the Blessed Virgin Mary under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows is beautiful and fitting in this time and place, as once again Our Lady sorrows for the great indignities done to God by the demonic minions of this world. She also weeps for us, her spiritual children who are persecuted not only from outside the Holy Church, but most especially from the false shepherds of the counterfeit "church" that seeks to feed the faithful with serpents and rocks rather than bread and fish (cf. S. Matthew 7:9 - 10). Praise God there are still brave and faithful Bishops and Priests who obey God rather than men (cf. Acts 5:29), and continue to nourish the faithful with True Sacraments and True Doctrine. These men are covered in Our Lady's mantle of protection and peace, and you, the good and holy faithful, must pray for us to stay faithful!

I must thank the faithful for their great care and assistance in the moving and unpacking of so many things! I have added some pictures of the new Oratory Chapel, still a work in progress, so wonderful to have the statue of the Sacred Heart and S. Francis, our titular patron,

I was not fully aware that I could not have Mass offerings said for non-Catholics who pass away or Catholics who pass away in sin.... I am really hoping you could help me understand this because I have so many passed away people enrolled and have had Masses said for that are living and aren't Catholic as well. If I've done something wrong or offensive to God I would totally want to know but be sad about it.

You must NEVER panic over these things...

- 1) The only Mass intention offered for a LIVING non-Catholic can be for their conversion to the True Faith. This intention would simply be published in a bulletin as *Private Intention*, just like asking for Holy Mass to be offered for a good grade or new job.
- 2) It is absolutely FORBIDDEN to offer Holy Mass for a deceased non-Catholic or for public sinners who refused to be reconciled to the Faith before death. This goes for enrolling a deceased non-Catholic in a Mass Guild,

as it is an act of sacrilege. Keep praying that your family and friends stay in the Church or come into the Church, especially with prayers and pious examples.

EMBER DAYS OF SEPTEMBER

In Please remember that this month we observe the **Ember Days of September**: Wednesday the 20th, Friday the 22nd and Saturday the 23rd. The Holy Church devotes these days to prayer, penance and sacrifice. On these three days the faithful are bound, under pain of mortal sin, to abstain from meat.

The current Laws of Fast and Abstinence (for the United States) are absolutely binding (unless lawfully excused or dispensed) for all the faithful. All baptised Catholics, seven years of age or older, are bound to abstain. The two types of abstinence are **complete** and **partial**. Complete abstinence forbids the eating of meat, and soup or gravy made with or from meat is required all Fridays throughout the year, Partial Abstinence, which permits meat, and soup or gravy made from meat, to be eaten only at the main meal, is required on Wednesday Ember and Ember Saturday.

The laws of **Fasting** are for all baptised Catholics,

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from ages 21 through 59, inclusive. On the days of fast only one full meal is allowed (with meat, except on Friday) with two smaller *meatless* meals, which together do not equal one full meal. The eating of food or snacks between meals is forbidden; however the drinking of liquids, including milk and juice, are allowed.

For reasons of health one may seek the reduction or even dispensation from the fast from the Monsignor; one should never simply dispense one's self from these obligations; and should one be lawfully dispensed from these obligations, he should strive to find another type of approved penance that can be satisfactory to Almighty God.

SUNDAYS OF SEPTEMBER: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for September:

3 September 2023:

Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of the S. Pope Pius X at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

10 September 2023:

Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of S. Nicholas of Tolentino at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

17 September 2023:

Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of the Stigmata of S. Francis of Assisi at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

24 September 2023:

Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost:

Commemoration of Our Lady of Ransom at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

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To correctly participate at Holy Mass one silently unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.

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PETER SPEAKS:



GOD predestined her from all eternity to be the Mother of the Incarnate Word, and for that reason so highly distinguished her among all His most beautiful works in the triple order of nature, grace and glory, that the Church justly applies to her these words: "I came out of the mouth of the Most High, the first-born before all creatures" (Ecclus. xxiv., 5). And when, in the first ages, the parents of mankind fell into sin, involving their posterity in the same ruin, she was set up as a pledge of the restoration of peace and salvation. The Only-Begotten Son of God ever paid to His Most Holy Mother indubitable marks of honour. During His private life on earth He associated her with Himself in each of His first two miracles: the miracle of grace, when, at the salutation of Mary, the infant leaped in the womb of Elizabeth; the miracle of nature, when He turned water into wine at the marriage - feast of Cana. And, at the supreme moment of His public life, when sealing the New Testament in His precious Blood, He committed her to His beloved Apostle in those sweet words, "Behold, Mother!" (S.
