LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

AND from the fig tree learn a parable: when the branch thereof is now tender, and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh, even at the doors. Amen I say to you, that this generation shall not pass, till all these things be done. Heaven and earth shall pass, but My words shall not pass. –

S. Matthew 24:32–35

WE in Southern California are quite aware that *summer is nigh*; both figuratively and literally. *Literally* because the heat is upon us (be sure to read the summertime reminder for the Oratory Dress Code) and *figuratively* because we are awash in the progressive immorality of our culture, politicians and “religious” leaders (the NewReligion of the *Novus Ordo*). How much longer will God’s hand be stayed before the increase of disease, war and disasters reach a state where no one can deny what is upon us? The homeland of my forefathers, Ireland, has apostatised from the Holy Faith with its overwhelming acceptance of sodomy, unnatural “marriage” and the murder of its unborn. Therefore, it is quite acceptable: I think this would be very good for you, not only physically, but mentally as it teaches you breath control which stimulates natural relaxation and focus.

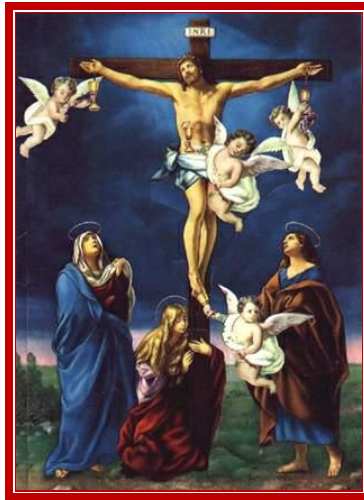

FEAST OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

SUNDAY the First of July is the great feast of the **MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST.**

EVER ANCIENT, EVER NEW

When S. Augustine penned these words in his *Confessions* he was lamenting how long it took him to see and appreciate the beauty of God. Since then the Church uses this term to describe things that contribute to the Church's idea *Pulchritas*, and how God remains the Primary Mover, and object, of all things beautiful; and when man encounters or rediscovers that beauty it is, to him, *ever ancient, ever new.*

Dr. Mark Ruttle, a musician of much renown (and personally known to me) has

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taken hymns from the Church's treasury and given them new life through careful resetting; as Catholic composers have done for centuries. Dr. Ruttle began the *Lumen Hilare* sacred music project in 2016 and has created music for anyone who enjoys the *first art* meant to lift the soul and honour God.

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FEAST OF THE OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

MONDAY the 16th of July is the great feast of **OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL**.

Devotion to Our Lady and her *Brown Scapular* is quite ancient, and has been encouraged by the saints and popes

The Scapular was originally part of the Religious Habit (worn on the shoulders that covers the front and back of the habit) worn by both sexes in various communities, most notably the Benedictines, Servites, Trinitarians, and, of course, the Carmelites. It is this latter Religious Order, and its lay confraternity, to which are attached the special Promises for those who are *clothed* in this scapular (in its large and small forms) by Our Lady.

The **Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel** is probably the oldest scapular and served as the prototype of the others. According to a pious tradition the Blessed Virgin appeared to **S. Simon Stock** at Cambridge, England,

on Sunday, 16 July, 1251. As an aside, the Monsignor and Father Matthew Howard made a pilgrimage to S. Simon's Shrine kept at Aylesford Priory in 1997 and prayed before his relics (his skull is visible through a glass and ceramic reliquary).

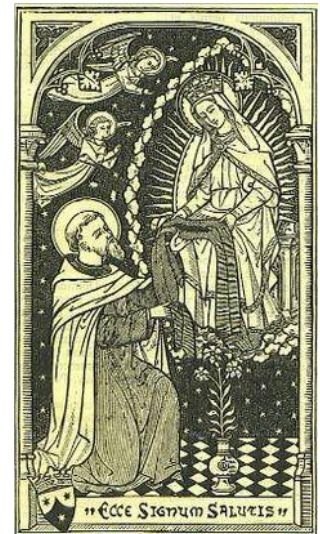
In answer to his appeal for help for his oppressed order, Our Lady appeared to S. Simon with a scapular in her hand and said: "Take, beloved son this scapular of thy order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant". The Catholic Encyclopedia tells us that the privilege was soon extended not only to the Religious of the Order but also its lay members, and:

Declares nothing else than that all those who out of true veneration and love for the Blessed Virgin constantly wear the scapular in a spirit of fidelity and confiding faith, after they have been placed by the Church itself with this habit or badge under the special protection of the Mother of God, shall enjoy this special protection in the matter and crisis which most concerns them for time and eternity. Whoever, therefore, even though he be now a sinner, wears the badge of the Mother of God throughout life as her faithful servant, not presumptuously relying on the scapular as on a miraculous amulet, but trustfully confiding in the power and goodness of Mary, may securely hope that Mary will through her powerful and motherly intercession procure for him all the

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necessary graces for true conversion and for perseverance in good. Such is the meaning and importance of the first privilege of the Carmelite Scapular, which is wont to be expressed in the words: "whoever wears the scapular until death, will be preserved from hell".

The second privilege of the scapular, known as the **Sabbatine Privilege**, may be briefly defined as meaning that Our Lady's motherly assistance for her servants in the Scapular Confraternity will continue after death, and will find effect especially on Saturday (the day consecrated to her honour), provided that the members fulfill faithfully the not easy conditions necessary for obtaining this privilege. Those conditions are *perpetual chastity*, daily recitation of the *Little Office of the Blessed Virgin* (or the Office one is bound to) or Fifteen Decades of the Holy Rosary, and abstaining from meat on all Wednesdays and Saturdays of the year. Dispensations or taking on other pious forms of sacrifice can only be granted by the Holy See or one's Bishop.

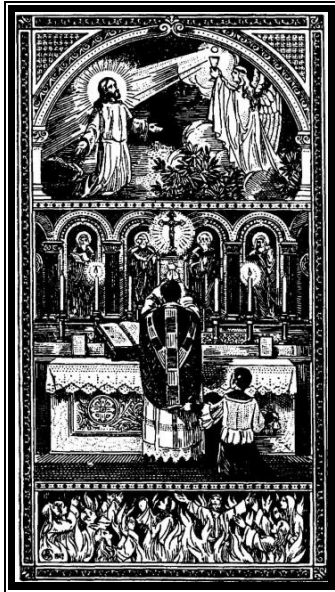
